Recognition from DRDO

To fortify this, I have requested to found honor in memory of Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam. The honor will be allowed away consistently during Independence Day. It will convey a monetary reward of ₹ 5 lakh, a gold decoration gauging eight gram and a testament." moreover, the Government of Tamil Nadu would remember his birthday every year as "Youth Awakening Day", on 15 October.

Recognition from Govt. of Kerala

APJ Abdul Kalam Technological University, otherwise called Kerala Technological University (KTU), is a state college situated in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, India. Dr. Abdul Kalam Island, previously known as Wheeler Island, is an island off the bank of Odisha, India, roughly 150 kilometers east of the state capital Bhubaneswar. The Integrated Test Range rocket testing office is situated on the island. The island was initially named after English commandant Lieutenant Hugh Wheeler. On 4 September 2015, the island was renamed to respect the late Indian president, Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam. The Odisha government distributed Abdul Kalam Island to the Defense Research and Development Organization (DRDO) in 1993, following A.P.J. Abdul Kalam's solicitation for land to manufacture a rocket testing office. Kalam alluded to the island as his "Theater of Action". In 1995, the Government relinquished the arrangement to move the test range from Chandipur to Baliapal and rather fabricated another test site known as Launch Complex-IV at Wheeler Island.
